

Steps To A Great Reflection

To make your journal truly reflective, you need the right ingredients. Use these simple steps to dig deeper into your experiences.

Plan your next steps

Note what you would change

Consider what you learnt

Explain how you felt

Describe what you did

From Boring to Brilliant!

A little reflection transforms a simple list of tasks into a powerful story of growth and learning.

A Basic Entry: "Today an employer came in to speak to us about their company, it was interesting."

A Reflective Entry:

What Happened? An employer came to speak to us about their company and working in the industry.

How I Felt: I didn't know what to expect so wasn't excited about it, but they were really engaging, and I enjoyed it more than I thought I would.

What I Learnt: I learnt a lot about the company including different career paths I could take, but I also learnt to be more positive about opportunities offered to me in the future.

What I Would Change: Next time I will try to be more confident and ask the questions I wanted to.

What's Next? I'm going to do some research on some of the job roles they mentioned to find out more.
